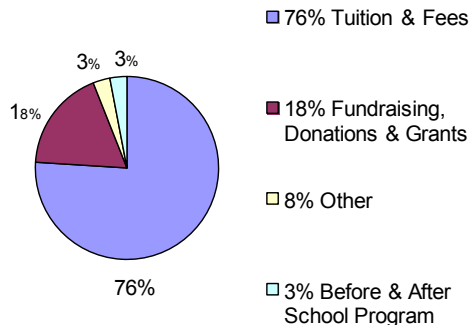
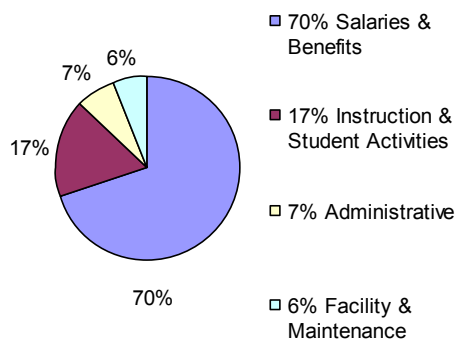

2010-2011 Income

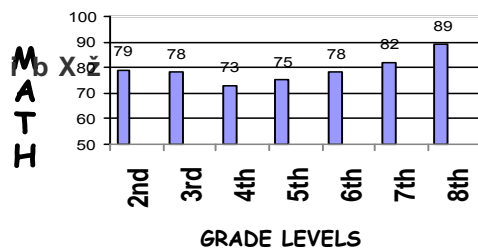
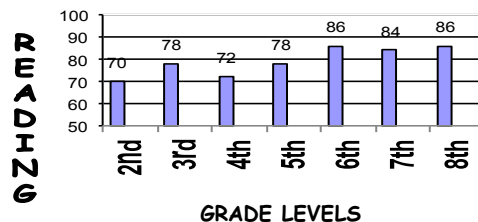


2010-2011 Expenses
